SUMMER TIDBIT: Blacklegged Ticks Identified in Montana

Educational Programs

The Montana Department of Public Health and Human Services (DPPHS) is announcing the identification of Ixodes scapularis (the "deer tick" or "blacklegged tick") within the state. This is the first time a blacklegged tick has been identified in the state through active surveillance. Blacklegged ticks are the primary vector responsible for transmitting diseases such as Lyme disease, Powassan virus disease, ehrlichiosis, babesiosis, anaplasmosis, and hard tick relapsing fever. Blacklegged ticks are present throughout much of the Northeast U.S., though in recent years, blacklegged ticks have expanded west, reaching as far as North Dakota. There are no known previous records of blacklegged ticks in Montana, though other non-human-feeding Ixodes spp. ticks had been documented in previous research surveys.
